SPICE ISLANDS of the MOLUCCA SEA Wildlife, Ports & Forts of the Trade Routes



BIRDS of PARADISE, GOLDEN BIRDWINGED BUTTERFLIES, lush JUNGLES, SNORKELLING in the Coral Triangle & Historic Colonial Forts. Sailing in style and escape to sunshine & warmth in **FEBRUARY 2022**

Escaping February's chills, we embark in the Spice Island Sultanate of Ternate for our specially designed unique itinerary, exploring the ancient trade routes and islands of the Molucca Sea. We sail in the company of outriggers, dugouts, sampans and an occasional old trading sloop as we voyage these abundant crystal waters.

Fought over throughout the sixteenth and early seventeenth centuries, we see the evocative ruins of Portuguese, Dutch and Spanish forts. On Halmahera, we visit Weda Bay, to walk quietly through the forests under trees used by males of Wallace's Birds of Paradise for their courtship displays. We venture into island interiors searching for the Golden Birdwing butterfly, deemed by Wallace to be "the finest butterfly in the world". Bacan Island offers a host of species, many endemic, from the

world's largest bee to cockatoos, lorikeets, hornbills and the elusive cuscus. We anchor off deserted, white-sand beaches, such as Goro-Goro and Kajao to swim and snorkel in the crystal waters or play on the ship's paddle boards and kayaks. On tiny Dowara Island, we visit the school and learn about sea-gypsy life in stilt houses above the clear waters. We explore deep into carefully preserved forest with our island guides from the port of Labuan enjoying the abundant birdlife and looking out for deer and monkeys.

Throughout our voyage, the stunning sparkling, soft-sand beaches of the world-famous 'Coral Triangle', frequented by turtles, vibrant reef fish offer the most glorious snorkeling. We

expect to see whale sharks, and manta rays amongst the coral gardens. The clove and nutmeg plantations of Dojinga, where Wallace realized the intricacies of Natural Selection, spurring Darwin's famous publication, will be our final island visit amongst these romantic and scented islands.



Explore forests, spot endemic birds and butterflies.
Stroll empty soft coral sand beaches.
Snorkel, swim, kayak, paddleboard or simply relax.
Days are busy or relaxed – the choice is yours!



Our itinerary may be adapted as we sail to allow for any local sightings or weather.





6th Feb: TERNATE: after a night in Ternate, we embark today on our beautiful ketch to sail south as we begin to immerse ourselves in the culture of the Moluccas, stopping first close to Halmahera island for a refreshing swim and our initial snorkel.

7th Feb: Halmahera & Kajao: we transfer across the island to Weda Bay, where the local community manages a foundation for education and conservation of the primary forest and its wildlife. The protected 700 hectares are home to Wallace's standard-wing Bird of Paradise, plus many other species. An early start enables us to be quietly below the trees used by males for their communal courtship display. Other

species such **as hornbills, giant cuckoos, parrots,** and possibly the **paradise-crow** as
well as other less-spectacular species **of Bird of Paradise** may also enrich the day, plus there
will be more opportunities for birdwatching in
the forests of Kajao.

8th Feb: Kajao & Western Bacan: After an early morning forest walk, we celebrate on deck as we cross the Equator to arrive at Bacan for village visits and an enjoyable swim or snorkel in the warm, inviting sea.

9th **Feb: Goro-Goro Village.** With local guides to assist us, we explore Goro-Goro, walking

through limestone karst scenery into a rainforest-clad valley. Bacan is where Alfred Russel Wallace discovered the

Golden Birdwing Butterfly and the **world's largest bee**, **Megachile pluto.** We'll keep a close watch for these and a host of other species, some of them endemic, including **parrots**, **cockatoos**, **lorikeets**, **hornbills**, the **elusive cuscus** and a rare **black macaque** – the only monkey in Maluku.

10nd **Feb: Dowara to Labuan (Overnight Passage).** After a lazy morning at sea, we arrive at the **sea-gypsy village** on Dowara, with its stilt houses and busy school. Later, we move to a nearby reef for a lazy afternoon amongst the warm waters to snorkel, kayak or simply read on deck before our overnight passage.

11th & 12th Feb: Labuan & Kasurita. From the small port of Labuan, we set forth with our local guides to explore the carefully controlled forest in search of golden-wing butterflies, deer and birdlife. After a more active morning, we return by car to the ship. Our afternoon and following day are flexible to allow us to take advantage of the most enjoyable local options. We will sail the maze of channels, visit the myriad of small nearby islands having time to walk ashore, explore, swim and absorb the history, wildlife and charms of these distant island chains.

13th Feb: Mauri & Tomilau are remote and rarely-visited, ours to enjoy with forest walks on Mauri and time to snorkel, swim, relax with a book, or take the opportunity to enjoy stand-up-paddle boarding or kayaking in the clear waters. We continue through the island channels gently moving north and east to our next island archipelago.








14th Feb: Tolimau & Gunange A two-hour cruise takes us to Tolimau with its many reefs, pristine beaches and calm waters. We meet the local fishermen, tour the lagoon using our zodiacs and have time at dusk to go bird spotting ashore before dinner on deck. 15th Feb: Makian & Tidore anchorage Now at the southern end of the Ternate island chain, this is a day of history and culture. We visit the ruins of an old **Dutch fort**, walk through the once-sought after clove plantations, villagers entertain us with a performance of their 'togal' music with flutes and stringed instruments. An afternoon's visit to the reef gives us time for a swim before we cruise to anchor off Tidore. 16th Feb: Tidore Today our tour (by car) takes us to the Sultan's well-preserved Spanish fort. We explore the vibrant local market where the islanders go about their everyday lives. Over lunch Ombak Putih relocates north, allowing time for snorkeling en route before our quiet overnight anchorage off Dojinga with our farewell dinner.



17th Feb: Dojina & TERNATE A short walk in the pretty riverside village takes us to where

Alfred Russel Wallace lived and penned his essay 'On the Tendency of Varieties to Depart Indefinitely from the Original Type'. We meet the cheerful locals and visit the ruins of a Portuguese fort before a short sail over lunch returns us to Ternate, where we disembark.





This is an 'exploring' itinerary designed between myself & the Seatrek team providing time for alterations to take advantage of wildlife conditions and sightings.

OMBAK PUTIH is a traditional Indonesian schooner custom built from Iron wood by Buginese ship builders, with a large saloon with covered seating and dining, as well as additional covered deck-dining. A major attraction are the wide areas of deck space with different comfortable 'lounging' spaces, both shaded and in the sun. There are 12 en suite cabins with portholes, each has individually controlled a/c, USB charging and ample storage. Shower rooms, en suite, are tiled and well designed. I was on board her in 2019 planning this itinerary and checking out generally, below are some of my photos. Strolling the decks barefoot, listening to the swish of the water and enjoying the peace, sunshine, food and snorkeling were magical.








GUIDES: the voyage will have two on-board guides:
