

# SCOTLAND'S DRAMATIC COAST

St. KILDA, COLONSAY, IONA, the OUTER HEBRIDES, LEWIS, SHIANT ISLES, SKYE, the SMALL ISLES & MULL in the warmth & long days of June.



In June's long summer days, we head south from Oban cruising the 'Isles of the Sea', to sail past the uninhabited Garvellachs Isles to gentle COLONSAY. This, our first magical island has the famous gardens of Colonsay House, with exotic shrubs and unexpected plants, we can wander the empty beaches or the fields of wildflowers.

Continuing south west towards Mull, lies the holy island of IONA, where the Abbey is lit with reflections from the sea. Walking across the island takes us to the 'Bay at the Back of the Ocean' where St Columba landed in 563AD. On to TIREE redolent of Viking raids, an island of empty beaches and Iron Age remains, to visit the evocative museum illustrating the building of Robert Louis Stevenson's Skerryvore Lighthouse – "the noblest of all the deep-sea lights". Crossing the Sea of the Hebrides, abundant with marine life, basking sharks, killer whales, seals and dolphins are regularly spotted from the decks, we sail past Barra Head, the southern tip of the Outer Hebrides, making our way to the spectacular, world-famous ARCHIPELAGO of ST KILDA, one of only 20 UNESCO sites listed worldwide for both environmental and cultural heritage.

We cruise the archipelago to anchor in Village Bay and explore the main island of HIRTA, once home to Britain's most remote island community. Strung like pearls around the bay, the tiny, empty houses abandoned in the 30's, are redolent of the once-thriving community. The tiny museum tells the dramatic story of the inhabitants' extraordinary existence and sad evacuation. Wildlife is everywhere, from the endemic St Kilda wren and mouse to Arctic skua chasing the puffins returning to their nesting burrows amongst the scentless mayweed on the jagged island spine of nearby DUN. Across the caldera, the towering, formidable island mass of BORERAY has fearsome sea cliffs rising over 1,260 foot. Raucous with nesting bird colonies, guillemots, kittiwakes, razorbills, fulmars and gannets jostle on the rocky ledges. Seals, porpoises and whales are regularly seen in the surrounding deep waters.



On board Guide, **AMELIA DALTON** began her life in Scotland in a vintage Arctic trawler transporting the National Trust for Scotland's work parties to **ST. KILDA**. She has voyaged these waters for over twenty years, delighting in the scenery, people, flora, wildlife and history and has visited St Kilda over 40 times. As a speaker, she has entertained passengers on rivers and at sea across the world, spoken at **Literary Festivals from Scotland to Cornwall**, appeared on **Saturday Live**, **BBC World Service**, **Radio Scotland** and **Radio London**. **IN ADDITION** we will



have on board MARTIN TREACHER who has been musician in residence at Skibo Castle as well as involved with an alliance of Scotland's leading hotels from Gleneagles to One Devonshire Gardens. He will pipe from

the top deck, entertain us on the piano over cocktails and after dinner whilst we enjoy a dram and also lead walks ashore. Martin & Amelia worked together from Scotland to Sri Lanka on board the Hebridean Island Cruises international ship, *Hebridean Spirit*.

We cruise past the lonely **FLANNAN ISLES**, much prized for their excellent grazing and made famous by the mysterious and still-unexplained disappearance of the 3 lighthouse keepers. Rounding the **Butt of Lewis**, the most northerly tip of the **OUTER HEBRIDES**, our ship arrives into the harbour of **Stornoway** in the island of **LEWIS**. As we experience life in these far-flung islands, we see the **Bronze Age standing Stones of Callanish**, dramatic and defensive **Carloway Broch**, a **traditional smoke house** and discover the intricacies of dying and spinning **Harris Tweed**.

Our third archipelago, is the **SHIANT ISLES**, again busy with seabirds nesting on the huge basalt columns linking with Staffa and the Giant's Causeway lava flows. The machair grass is dotted with cushions of sea pinks, **Compton MacKenzie's cottage** nestles under the cliff, whilst puffins whirr overhead. Next we go to

SKYE to visit dramatic DUNVEGAN CASTLE dating from the 13<sup>th</sup> century, the castle is the ancestral home of the Clan MacLeod. Tucked away at the head of the loch, the Castle has charming gardens and a resident seal colony. Voyaging south, we call at the Small Isles to CANNA, the most sheltered and charming. Verdant and peaceful, this is an exceptional island. Corncrakes nest regularly in the tiny fields, puffins make their burrows on the sea cliffs; dog roses, asphodel, Hebridean butterflies and spotted marsh orchids abound in these high summer days of long light. In the afternoon, we call at MULL to



the pretty fishing harbour of **Tobermory** with its colourful shops, distillery and famous pub. Finally, we cruise the **Sound of Mull**, a beautiful, sheltered stretch of water encapsulating the glories of the West Coast, with its cliffs, lighthouses and crofts: finally we pass **Duart Castle** guarding the historic channel.





## ITINERARY \*: Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> June 2025: EMBARKATION

ArnamurchanLight with Isle of Eigg beyond

Transfer Glasgow to Oban for embarkation. Cruise south past the Isle of Kerrera & Garvellachs, the Isles of the Sea.

#### Wed. 11th June: ISLES of COLONSAY & IONA

**Colonsay**, visit the **Gardens** and see the superb collection of rhododendrons, or walk over the island to **Kildoran Bay**. Afternoon visit holy **Iona**, see the **Abbey**, or walk to **The Bay at the Back of the Ocean**, cruise past **Staffa**.

# Thurs. 12<sup>th</sup> June: ISLE of TIREE & Cruising the Sea of Hebrides.

At Hynish on **Tiree**, visit the famous **Skerryvore Lighthouse Museum**, detailing this extraordinary feat of engineering. Afternoon cruise the **Minch** renowned for its **abundant marine life**, including orca, dolphins & basking sharks.

#### Fri. 13th June: ST KILDA ARCHIPELAGO & Flannan Isles & OUTER HEBRIDES.

Anchored in **Village Bay** we land to explore the island of **Hirta**, before a cruise of the **archipelago** alive with seabird colonies before heading north past the lonely **Flannan Isles**, to round the **Butt of Lewis** and berth in **Stornoway**.

# Sat. 14th June: OUTER HEBRIDES: Stornoway, ISLE of LEWIS.

Our visits on **Lewis** include the **Callanish Stones**, the **Carloway Broch**, a defensive structure unique to Scotland, a typical **Harris Tweed Mill**, favoured by **Chanel** and **Vivienne Westwood**, and taste exceptional smoked salmon at a **traditional Smokery**.

## Sun. 15th June: SHIANT ISLES & ISLE of SKYE, Loch Dunvegan.

Exploring the seabird colonies of the **Shiant Isles**, puffins, auks & seals surround our tenders. **Afternoon** to the magnificent **Castle of Dunvegan**, the stronghold of the Clan MacLeod tucked into the north west peninsula of **SKYE**.

#### Mon. 16<sup>th</sup> June: SMALL ISLES, CANNA & ISLE of MULL, Tobermory

Walking and exploring **Canna** to see birds, orchids and butterflies. Afternoon on **MULL**, at the pretty little port of **Tobermory:** visit the west coast's most charming little town, pubs, book shops and the island distillery.

# Tues. 17th June 2025: Cruise Sound of Mull. Disembark in Oban, transfer to Glasgow

Exploring the islands of Scotland's convoluted west coast can only be done properly by ship. In comfort and style, we voyage on board the ship chosen by **H.M. the late Queen** and specially built for these waters. She carries just **47 passengers** and, with an attentive & experienced crew, we cruise these intricate waters in safety and elegance. Meals are sumptuous and varied, wines abundant and the stunning views of far-flung islands, sea bird colonies, castles and marine life unfurl before us as we dine. An open **Bridge** 

policy and plenty of deck space enable us to absorb the remarkable scenery, or simply marvel at the drama from the large windows of the Lounge, Library and Conservatory.

**CABINS** are sumptuous. Each is different from the next, but all are furnished in traditional






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




# **Princess Deck**




